

# WILDFLOWER MEADOW

Wildflower Meadow is a dazzling display of Nature's spring wildflower show interpreted in canvas embroidery. Lois calls this a *needlepoint threadscape*. Enjoy the magnificent native flora of this breathtaking mountain landscape in Crested Butte, Colorado. This piece explores the many facets of green in a multitude of thread textures and types including wool, silk and overdyed cottons.



Stitches include brick, bullion knot, colonial knot, elongated daisy, diagonal mosaic, Diane's lace, escalator, eyelet, Florentine variation, French knots, Gobelin-horizontal, random and slanted, satin and tent. Threads include Burmilana, Waterlilies, Perle cotton, Gumnut Daisies and Opals, JL Walsh silk and silk and wool, overdyed cotton, Rainbow Gallery Splendor and Soie d'Alger silk.

This piece was taught at National Seminar and was on congress cloth but Lois will be teaching this piece on 18 count canvas. The size will be a bit bigger than the 4 inch by 6 inch original. Go to our website to see the photo in color.

Lois holds a teacher's certification from the National Academy of Needlearts. She has taught at several ANG National Seminars as well as the EGA National Seminar. She has won numerous awards including the Small Masterpiece award at the ANG National Seminar.
